The first-ever museum exhibition in Los Angeles of Keith Haring, features over 120 artworks and archival materials. Known for his use of vibrant color, energetic linework and iconic characters like the barking dog, Haring's work is rooted in the creative spirit and mission of his subway drawings and renowned public murals: art is for everybody.

Kristyan Sarkis — The Way I See It,...

Stedelijk Museum | Amsterdam, The Netherlands

Kristyan Sarkis is one of the most exciting type designers and lettering artists. Eloquent and expressive, even for those unable to read Arabic, his typographic works often hint at the content of the text. Collaborating with the poet Hind Eljadid, he animates the energy and emotion of the poems.



Over the Rainbow

Centre Pompidou | Paris, France

Bringing together more than five hundred artworks and documents, mainly from the Centre Pompidou collection, this exhibition sets out to show how, since the beginning of the 20th century, artists have contributed to transforming the representation of the LGBTQIA+ communities.

***Cecily Brown: Death and the Maid***

April 4, 2023 - December 3, 2023

The Metropolitan Museum of Art | New York, NY

This is the first full-fledged museum survey of Brown's work in New York since she made the city her home, the exhibition assembles a select group of some fifty paintings, drawings, sketchbooks, and monotypes from across her.

***Henry Taylor: B Side***

Whitney Museum of American Art | New York, NY

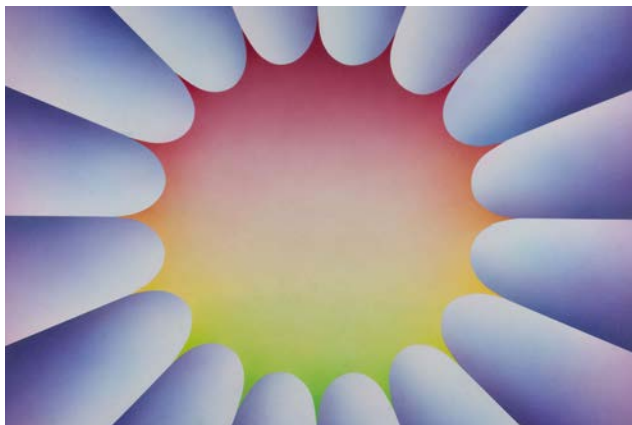
Through painting, drawing, sculpture, and installation, this retrospective celebrates an artist widely appreciated for his unique aesthetic and social vision. Taylor's portraits are populated by friends, relatives, strangers, athletes, politicians, and entertainers.

***Judy Chicago: Herstory***

October 12, 2023 - January 14, 2024

New Museum | New York, NY

Spanning Judy Chicago's sixty-year career and encompassing painting, sculpture, installation, drawing, textiles, photography, stained glass, needlework, and printmaking, the exhibition will place six decades of Chicago's work in dialogue with work by other women across centuries in a unique installation.





Tarek Atoui: Waters' Witness

September 15, 2023 - February 4, 2023

Museum of Contemporary Art | Sydney, Australia

Atoui's documents the acoustic identities of port cities that are deeply connected to their harbors. Recording sounds close to the sea and under the water, Atoui produces a unique score for each city which becomes part of the work's growing soundscape and a source of inspiration for new sound sculptures.

Philip Guston

October 5, 2023 - February 25, 2024

Tate Modern | London, UK

Guston was a complex artist who took inspiration from the nightmarish world around him to create new and surprising imagery. This exhibition explores how his paintings bridged the personal and the political, the abstract and the figurative, the humorous and the tragic.



Going Dark: The Contemporary Figure at the Edge of Visibility

October 20, 2023 - April 7, 2024

Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum | New York, NY

The exhibition brings together a multigenerational group of artists who engage the "semi-visible" figure—representations that are partially obscured. In its inherent tension between clarity and occlusion, the semi-visible figure is a site of great material complexity and experimentation.



Back to the Future: An Exploration of Contemporaneity in Korean Contemporary Art

June 16, 2023 - May 26, 2024

National Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art | Seoul, Korea

The exhibition is organized with the intention of sharing artwork from the collection of the museum with the public. Covering artworks acquired by the museum over a five-year period, from 2018 to 2022, it thoroughly examines the characteristics of noteworthy acquisitions.
