

Best London Exhibitions in 2024



Judy Chicago: Revelations Through September 1, 2024 Serpentine North Gallery

Judy Chicago's largest solo exhibition in London revolves around an unpublished 1970s manuscript and iconic works like *The Dinner Party*, spanning her six-decade career and emphasizing feminist themes through drawing, installations, and participatory elements.



Tavares Strachan: There Is Light Somewhere Through September 1, 2024 Hayward Gallery

The exhibition celebrates unsung explorers and cultural pioneers through Strachan's inventive works, including new sculptures, large-scale collages, neon pieces, and mixed-media installations. It offers a playful yet impactful journey, highlighting histories of colonialism and racism while addressing the universal quest for belonging.

The Story Behind Each Word Must Be Told Through August 10, 2024 Ab - Anbar Gallery

Nil Yalter's *The Story Behind Each Word Must Be Told* explores resilience amidst fragility through the Aşık tradition of Anatolia, emphasizing the power of words in visual and oral forms. The exhibition includes works from her career and a 1979 LP with Bernard Dupaigne for exiled bard Aşık Nesimi.



Yoko Ono: Music of the Mind Through September 1, 2024 Tate Modern

The exhibition features more than 200 works that cover seven decades of Ono's career. By using written instructions that prompt visitors to imagine, feel, create, or complete the artwork, Ono's unconventional approach offers a unique perspective for visitors to engage with the pieces.



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Yinka Shonibare CBE: Suspended States Through September 1, 2024 Serpentine South Gallery

Yinka Shonibare CBE's *Suspended States* exhibition at Serpentine South examines boundaries and power dynamics using Dutch wax print, showcasing installations like "Sanctuary City" and "The War Library", and highlighting his social initiatives in Hackney and Nigeria.



Fragile Beauty: Photographs from the Sir Elton John and David Furnish Collection Through January 5, 2025 V&A South Kensington

Fragile Beauty features over 300 rare prints from Sir Elton John and David Furnish's collection, showcasing iconic photography from the 20th and 21st centuries, exploring themes of strength, vulnerability, and historical significance.





Penny Slinger: Exorcism: Inside Out Through September 7, 2024 Richard Saltoun Gallery

Exorcism: Inside Out showcases Penny Slinger's original photo-collages, prints, and video, coinciding with the release of her extended book 'An Exorcism: A Photo Romance'. The immersive exhibition explores themes of the feminine psyche, eroticism, and identity.



Alvaro Barrington: Grace Through January 26, 2025 Tate Britain

Alvaro Barrington's installation at Tate Britain honors his grandmother, mother, and sister through a vibrant exploration of Caribbean heritage and identity. Curated by Dominique Heyse-Moore and team, the exhibition celebrates Black culture and grace under foreign conditions.



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
