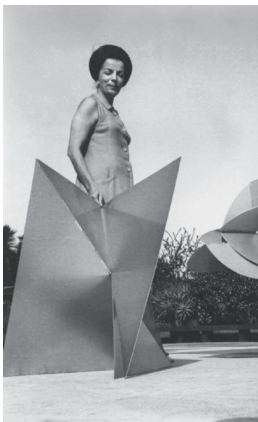

Lygia Clark: The I and The You

This major UK survey celebrates Brazilian artist Lygia Clark, focusing on her transformative work from the mid-1950s to early 1970s. Central to the Neo-concrete movement, Clark's innovative approach challenged geometric abstraction with greater experimentation and viewer participation.



Van Gogh: Poets and Lovers

This exhibition features Vincent van Gogh's most spectacular paintings and extraordinary drawings, showcasing his transformative period in the south of France. Highlights include 'Starry Night over the Rhône' and 'The Yellow House'. Explore Van Gogh's vibrant colors and textures, celebrating the artist's deep connections with poetry and romance.



Must See London Exhibitions

Francis Bacon: Human Presence

Through January 19, 2025
National Portrait Gallery

This exhibition delves into Francis Bacon's profound engagement with portraiture, featuring over 55 works from the 1950s onwards. It examines how Bacon redefined the genre through his responses to earlier artists. The exhibition includes portraits of notable figures such as Lucian Freud, Isabel Rawsthorne, Peter Lacy, and George Dyer.



Zanele Muholi: A Retrospective

This exhibition features over 260 works by South African photographer Zanele Muholi, highlighting key series such as *Only Half the Picture*, *Faces and Phases*, and *Somnyama Ngonyama*. Celebrating South Africa's Black LGBTQIA+ communities, the show explores themes of identity and resistance, and includes new photographic and sculptural works.



Lauren Halsey: Emajendat

Through March 2, 2025
Serpentine South Gallery

Lauren Halsey's *Emajendat* transforms the space into a dynamic "Funk garden," blending elements of South Central Los Angeles with prismatic visuals, sculptures, and her first moving image work. Celebrating Black culture, the exhibition reflects her vision of community empowerment and a future sculpture park in South Central.



Brasil! Brasil! The Birth of Modernism

January 28 – April 21, 2025
Royal Academy of Arts

The exhibition explores Brazilian Modernism from the 1910s to the 1970s, showcasing how artists blended contemporary trends with Indigenous, Afro-Brazilian, and local influences. Featuring works by underrepresented artists like Tarsila do Amaral and Rubem Valentim, it highlights Brazil's rich cultural heritage.





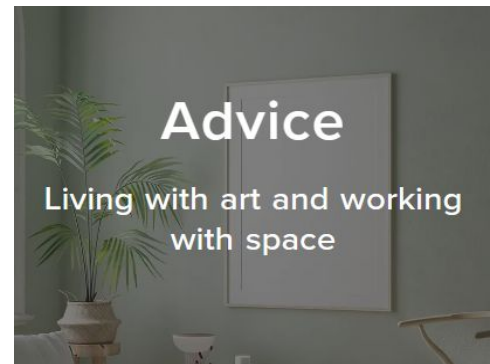
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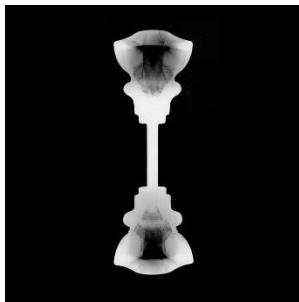
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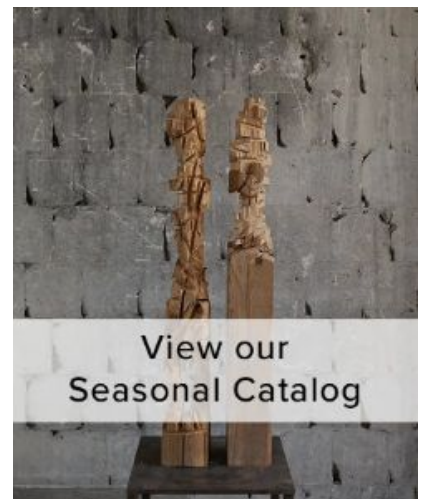
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
